Alumni Spotlight:

A Career Built on a 4-H Foundation

When she was a junior in high school, Angela (Hazlett) Krile had no idea that a contact she made through a 4-H event would lead her to a 13-year career at one of Columbus's premier strategic communications firms.

While serving on the Ohio 4-H Advisory Board, Angela met an executive from Bob Evans Farms, who invited her to apply for an internship in public relations once she entered college. Angela applied, and worked in the PR department at the restaurant chain's corporate offices for three years during summer and holiday breaks from college. Upon graduating, the same executive recommended Angela for a position with Cochran Group Inc., a strategic communications consulting company in Columbus. Cochran normally didn't hire recent graduates, but because of the personal recommendation, they agreed to interview Angela - and hired her 13 years ago.
