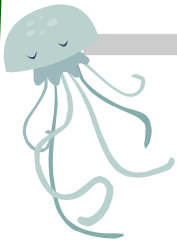

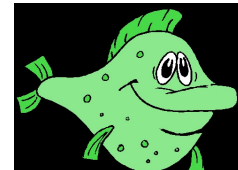
Jungle beasts, circus critters, farm animals, amphibians and aquatic vertebrates, will all be a part of the 4-H Camp tradition for Henry County campers in 2011. 4-H'ers will be actively engaged in games, dances, team building activities, skits, campfire, outdoor education, candle lighting ceremony and much more.

Each camper may name one friend to stay with at camp. Please be sure to complete the appropriate blank on the registration form. Be sure this friend is going to camp! Even though the capacity at 4-H Camp Palmer is quite large, it is LIMITED. We recommend that you send in your registration soon to avoid disappointment. Deadline for registration is June 20th and is on a first come, first served basis.

4-H Camp is one of the most popular of 4-H activities offered to Henry County 4-H'ers. Camp is held at 4-H Camp Palmer, a 146 acre camp located just outside of Fayette, Ohio. It is adjacent to Harrison Lake State Park and is privately owned by 4-H members in 11 northwest Ohio counties.

All 4-H members 8 or 9 years (or completed the 3rd grade) through 14 years of age as of 1/1/11 (and completed 8th grade this year) are eligible to attend. 4-H'ers may sponsor non-4-H buddies to attend camp also. The same age limits apply.



The camp fee this year is \$135.00 for 4-H members. The "buddy" price is \$150.00. The camp fee includes housing, meals, snacks and a camp photo. In

addition, the fee covers the cost of a nurse on duty, qualified lifeguards, camp insurance, a craft activity, camp counselors and a host of other camp experiences. It is the camper's responsibility to provide their own transportation to camp and home.



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Description of Camp Life...



At camp we want our campers to have fun and learn many things. You will make friends with boys and girls across the county who will have ideas different than your own. You will get to know the outdoors because it is where you spend most of your time. You will become skilled in a variety of program activities. As well, you will learn to get along with others and compete in various activities with team members of your assigned group. Swimming will be offered at various times during the day along with plenty of other fun and exciting activities for you to enjoy. You won't be bored!

All camp activities are held in various facilities including the Craft pavilion, Nature lab, multi-purpose Recreation hall, Adirondack Shelter and Dining Hall. Recreational activities take place on the sports field, tennis court, basketball court, miniature golf course, archery range, swimming pool and Harrison Lake (canoeing). Campers live in cabins near the central area of camp. As campers arrive at the registration area they will be given their cabin number and name. Each camper has his/her own bunk and area for personal belongings in their cabin. Boys and girls bunk in separate cabins which are separated by a stream. Our first year (and sometimes second year) girl campers are lodged in one of the dorm areas in the Woodland Lodge and first year boys lodge in another of the dorm areas. Campers may request to stay in the same cabin with a friend. If you are sponsoring a 4-H "buddy" they will also stay in your cabin.

Travel groups are named by the counselors and each camper is assigned to a group. 4-H "buddies" are in the same travel group as the host 4-H'er. We do not, however, accommodate any requests by campers to be in specific travel groups. Part of the camp experience is to meet new friends and get to know others from all areas of the county.

Home-style meals are served in the large, comfortable dining hall. Three family-style meals and an evening snack are the tradition at camp and the food is delicious! A salad bar is offered at both the noon and evening meals. This style of dining provides our young people an opportunity to learn and practice etiquette, working together in doing chores and trying perhaps, new food items.

Extras At Camp...

In addition to what is offered through the camp fees, 4-H Camp Palmer has some extras of their own to offer at the Camp Store. The store has t-shirts, hats, sweat-shirts, backpacks, novelty items and souvenirs, candy bars and frozen snacks. Campers bringing money to camp are asked to "deposit" their spending money in our county camp bank for safekeeping— the bank is open during times that the store is open. During open recreation times the 4-H Camp Palmer store will be open for purchases campers would like to make. The Camp Store will be open as campers arrive and as campers depart for any last minute purchases they may want to

Dear 4-H Camper & Parents:

For many of you this may be the first time you have considered attending 4-H Camp, for others 2011 might be the last year in which you attend camp. You may have lots of questions and you may not have any. This brochure is designed to possibly answer some of those questions ahead of time. CHECK-IN:

*Check -in time will be available beginning at **3:00 p.m. on Thursday June 23** at 4-H Camp Palmer for our campers. **PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE ANY SOONER THAN 3:00 P.M.** At 4:45 p.m. campers will be assembling for their first activity. We ask that parents and others vacate camp by 4:30 p.m.

*When you arrive at camp you will be greeted at the entrance by some of our camp counselors. From the entrance please proceed to the Nature Center (first building on your right after you walk through the bridge) where you will check-in. Lines will be formed by boys/girls. From this line you will need to go through the nurse's line and/or the bank line. The procedures, I am sure will be clearer when you actually arrive.

*The 4-H Camp **Health Form** must be completed and you will hand this to the nurse. **DO NOT** send the health form with your child's registration. Please have it available to turn in along with any medications (NOT packed away in luggage). We are fortunate to have Nurse Janelle Cline who will be available at all times during camp. (Parents will be notified if a doctor or hospital attendance is needed.)

*Each camper will receive a printed schedule of the weeks activities. This will be the campers' way of knowing when and where each activity will take place. Campers are to pre-register for "Choose Your Own" Activities so that we can note their selections on their name tags. In addition, their cabin number and group name will also be printed on the name tags. Name tags are given as campers check-in.

*Camp offers many opportunities for new experiences and friendships in an outdoor environment. We will do everything we can to make each campers' experience fun and educational. Campers need to participate in order to have the most positive of experiences as well. I ask that campers sign the **Camper's Commitment** form on the back of the registration form.

CHECK-OUT:

*The final morning of camp, **June 27th**, is filled with clean-up activities and our closing comments around the flag pole. Campers have to bring all their luggage from the cabins up to the volleyball court (or Rec Hall if it is raining). Each cabin is assigned an area to clean-up before we have our closing. Therefore, I ask that you arrive to pick up your child/ren at approximately 9:50-10:00 a.m. **We will have our closing at 9:45 a.m. with official dismissal from camp at 10:00 a.m.** We will be gathering all campers who have a dismissal restriction or designee other than a parent/grandparent picking them up (circle of chairs by the flag pole). If your child/ren are NOT to leave camp on Monday morning or at any other time with anyone other than you, please indicate this on the health form. A counselor will check off each camper as the person who is responsible for the camper arrives. As all of our campers leave camp I ask that you stop at the main entrance and check-out with staff. This is a precautionary measure in case any situations arise before I leave camp myself. Campers will receive their camp photo at this time also.



WHAT TO BRING: (PLEASE MARK ALL OF YOUR ITEMS)

- Bedding (including sheets and blankets OR a sleeping bag AND pillow)
 *You may want to bring a sheet to cover the mattress if you bring a sleeping bag.
- 2 Towels
- 1-2 Washcloths
- 1 Beach Towel
- Flashlight (with batteries)
- Comfortable clothes (not new)
- Sweatshirt or jacket
- Rain poncho or rain coat
- Clothing or costumes to fit the themes (see back of brochure)
- Personal hygiene items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush/paste, deodorant, etc.)
- White t-shirt or clothing item (socks, shorts, white cloth tote bag) for tie-dyeing *if you are signing up for Tie Dying as a "Choose Your Own" Activity.
- Bathing Suit
- Two Pairs of shoes (not new) *****Bring costumes/items that fit with the theme/s. See page:**
- Flip-flops for the shower and pool area
- Spending money (optional for camp store)
- A spirit of willingness to try new things, make new friends and work together!
- Other Optional Items to consider: Camera (PLEASE MARK WITH CAMPER NAME)
- Rug/mat for cabin by bunk
- Snacks (**MUST BE IN AIRTIGHT CONTAINERS**)

The more youth we have at camp, the more fun we have! The more campers we have attend, the better price per unit category we fall under the following year. I think it is important to be flexible in working with our youth who want to attend camp but might have sporting events during our camp. With this in mind, I hope you will contact me about such situations so that we can work together to provide your child the opportunity to attend camp.

One-way Camper Email is offered to parents and relatives so that they may send an email to their camper during camp. Emails are faxed each night to the camp office and are ready to deliver first thing each morning. Parents and relatives may register and purchase credits for \$1.00 each. The different messages cost different amounts of credits. Messages included are: *Simple Message *Message with border *Message with game (word search, Sudoku, etc) *Message with a photo. Enclosed in this camp packet is the paperwork for parents and relatives to fill out to participate. This is a great alternative to regular mail that may not get sent or received in a timely manner.

Lastly, I hope you will take the time to read through the **Camp Guidelines** with your child/ren prior to arriving at camp. Specific details are provided to our campers the first day at camp, but it helps to have parents reinforce expectations as well. Under no circumstance should a cell phone be left with a camper! I, along with the camp counselors and CITs look forward to serving the 4-H youth attending camp this year! If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact me at 419-592-0806. How do I send a Bunk Note (one-way email) to my camper?

Follow the instructions above except, after registering, simply sign in and click on the Bunk Notes button. Enter your camper's name, select the correct cabin, type your message, and hit the "Send" button.

Why do I have to pay to send Bunk Notes (one-way email)?

Each morning, the Bunk Notes system bundles and sorts the messages for us to print out and distribute to campers. It also protects us from computer viruses and allows us to easily manage these emails. Your payment helps us cover the cost of the system, paper, ink, and labor and, more importantly, frees us to do what we do best – be with your kids! Bunk Note credits cost \$1 each and are purchased in packs of various sizes.

Can other relatives use these services?

Certainly. Once you have set up your account, you will be able to invite other people to access these services.

What do I do if I lost my username and password?

You can get it online by going to www.Bunk1.com and clicking on the link "Lost Your Password?" (to the left of the page below the sign in button). You will receive an email with your username and password within a few minutes.

Henry County 4-H Camp Guidelines

1. Campers are not permitted to leave camp at any time without the consent of the Henry County 4-H Camp Director, parent or legal guardian or camp nurse. If leaving with a parent upon request, please check out and upon returning check-in with the Camp Nurse or Camp Director.
2. The bell is to be used to signal group changes and the P.A. for emergency purposes. The Adult Staff and counselors have authorization to use these devices only.
3. The following areas and equipment are to be used only with staff supervision or during assigned times: a. Pool b. Wetlands, streams and lake c. Canoes d. Nature Center
e. Shooting Sports range f. High ropes & zip-line g. Sporting equipment room

4. Dining Hall etiquette:

*Campers will wash or sanitize their hands before each meal. Campers select a table to sit at for the duration of camp for all meals. Campers may be excused from the meal table by a counselor, camp director or nurse.

*Proper attire is to be worn at all meals. Hats need to be taken off upon entering the dining hall. Campers wearing swimsuits to meals should wear shorts and a shirt over them.

5. Cabin etiquette:

*Campers are expected to respect individual's property. No one should be in anyone's belongings without permission.

*Girl campers are to be in girl's cabins and area; boys in boy's cabins and area.

*Cabin inspection will be anytime from 9:00-11:45 a.m. daily. Campers are responsible for cleaning areas around the cabins, buildings and trash receptacles. Clean cabins will be selected each day for boys and girls. Dirty cabins will also be selected each day.

*when it is time for lights out- lights are to be off, radios off, flashlights off and campers in their bunks.

6. Other Expectations:

- a. Campers should always be with their assigned groups during group activities (unless with the camp nurse or director).
- b. All injuries or illnesses need to be reported to the camp nurse. The camp nurse will be the only person to dispense medicine to campers.
- c. NO drugs, alcohol, fireworks or **cell phones** are allowed at camp. Cell phones confiscated will be kept by the camp director until the end of camp.
- d. NO profanity.
- e. Shoes must be worn at all times.
- f. NO vehicles permitted on the camp.
- g. NO visitors are permitted without permission of the Camp Director. Such visitations should be arranged ahead of time.

Lastly, any individual found doing damage to any area of the camp facilities, especially recreational equipment and within the cabins, will be disciplined by the Camp Director. The camper/s will be charged the cost of replacement or repairs. Parents will be notified immediately of such activity.

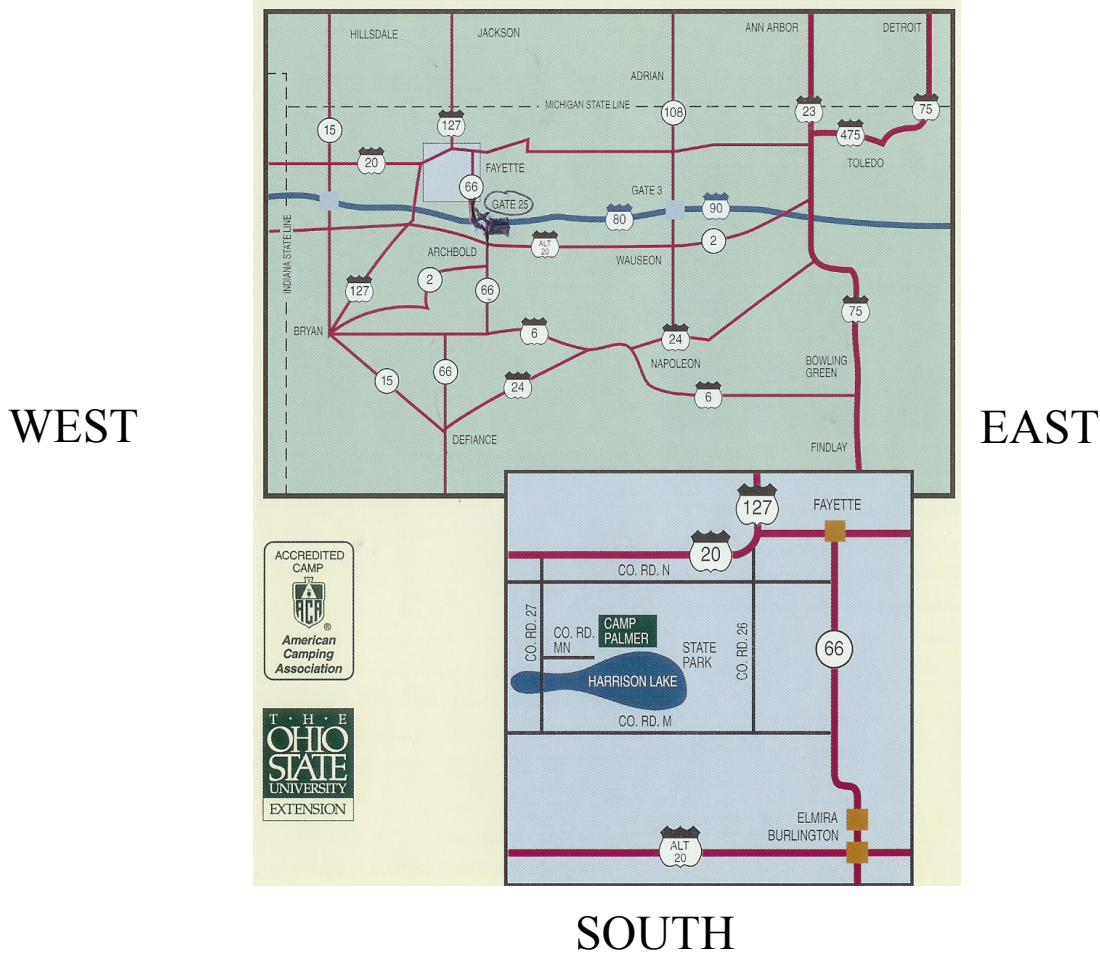
