

## How much will it cost?

The 4-H camp fees include all meals & snacks, **4 nights of lodging**, crafts, and general camp activities. The cost for camp is \$155 for all campers and is due May 27. Late registration is \$165 if received between May 28 and June 3. Partial camp scholarships are available for families who have financial need. Scholarship forms are available online at [clinton.osu.edu](http://clinton.osu.edu) or at the Extension office. Scholarship forms are due May 12. Full refunds are available until May 27.

Optional camp photos may be ordered on the registration form for \$9. The 4-H canteen will have t-shirts, water bottles, lanyards, pencils and other 4-H items as well as snacks. Items will range in price from 50 cents to \$15.

From Interstate 71, Exit 45 take State Route 73 east towards Wilmington. Kirkwood is approximately 1.5 miles on the right. Camp Kirkwood is approximately 4 miles west from Wilmington on State Route 73.

Pack your bags, tell your friends, and get moving to sign up for Clinton County 4-H Camp!

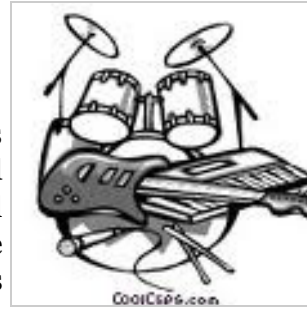

### What is expected from the Campers?

Members need to read and sign the behavioral expectations that are included in this mailing. The camper and parent must read and sign this form and return it with the camp registration form and fee by May 27. The camp staffs goal is for all campers to have fun and be safe at 4-H Camp!



### What will I do at Camp?

4-H Camp offers a wide variety of fun activities such as archery, swimming, canoeing, fishing, recreational sports, flag ceremonies, nature hikes, team games, dancing, movies, special guests, speakers, and lots of cabin fun with camp counselors and many other boys or girls close in age.

### What do I take to Camp?

Sunscreen, pants, **tennis shoes**, flip flops to wear to the pool, old shoes for canoeing, towels, toothbrush & paste, soap, jacket or sweatshirt, sleeping bag & pillow, shorts, music for the dances, swimming suit, Fishing pole, socks, plastic bag for dirty clothes, cards, money for the canteen, flashlight, and a water bottle. Please do not send extra food with your child to camp. Snacks and water are always available in the Lakeside Lodge for campers and counselors.

### What's at Camp?

Campers will have the opportunity to stay in rustic cabins located on 214 acres. The camp facilities include a centralized lodge and conference room, nature trails, craft rooms, 3 campfire sites, basketball courts, tetherball, sand volleyball courts, archery range, fossil areas, swimming pool, and a pond for fishing and canoeing.

### When is Camp?

Clinton County 4-H Camp is Tuesday, June 7 through Saturday, June 11. Campers will arrive between 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. the first day and leave at 11:00 a.m. the last day of camp. Don't forget the camp open house is from 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. on June 7. Family members are invited to join us for snacks in the Lakeside Lodge and feel free to take a walking tour of camp.
